This Week's Round in Review

MAFL Wagers

In truth, wagering profit rarely accrues to the timid and the circumspect as the effects of over-round on a series of bets are relentless and, like water dripping on a stone, eventually erode any bankroll, regardless of its size.

Far better then to be bold and to wager extravagantly on outrageous chances, courting ruin while at the same time prising open the door to potential good fortune.

So believeth, it seems, the Heritage Fund.

('Good money after bad' others might say).

Here's the detail:

1. Chi Fund: Richmond, 6.47% @ \$1.62 against Carlton

This is Chi's first bet for the season on Richmond and, given their general form, you can hardly blame him for that.

It's also the first time he's wagered against the Blues, so there's absolutely no form to go on.

(Perhaps a little concerning is the fact that he's only tipping the Tigers to win by 2 points and that he originally fancied the Blues until the market reopened after a brief suspension and the Tigers moved from \$1.90 equal favourites to \$1.62 outright favourites.)

2. Heritage Fund: St Kilda, 7.97% @ \$2.35 against the Roos Line Fund: St Kilda, 7.79% @ \$1.90 +11½ points against the Roos

It's fair to proclaim that St Kilda has not been kind to MAFL Investors this year. The Heritage Fund and the Line Fund are both 0 and 2 on Saints wagers this year.

The Heritage Fund is also 0 and 2 when wagering against the Roos (the Line Fund has not previously bet against the Roos), so the portents are hardly encouraging for this game either.

3. Heritage Fund: Port Adelaide, 15.97% @ \$5.25 against the Bulldogs

An interesting time for the Heritage Fund to roll out its largest wager of the season.

The game's at Marrara in the Territory, so the venue is something of an unknown, but the Dogs are on the end of a four-game winning streak, while the Power have lost their last three.

It's the Heritage Fund's first bet on Port but it's also its fifth bet against the Bulldogs for which its record is 0 and 5.

4. Heritage Fund: Melbourne, 8.43% @ \$4.20 against the Lions

Somehow, as I think I've said before, it just wouldn't be the weekend unless MAFL Investors had money riding on the Dees.

So far this season the Heritage Fund is 1 and 5 when wagering on the Dees; it's previously not wagered against the Lions.

For absolute clarity, I'm funding most of this week's Heritage Fund wagering on the condition that, in the first instance, any profit goes to repay the credit extended. Any additional profit will then flow into the Heritage Fund. In effect, those Investors in the Heritage Fund have been granted a zero-recourse, zero-rate, short-term credit facility. Try finding one of those in the marketplace.

Should the Heritage Fund prove to be unprofitable again this week, further credit might or might not be forthcoming.

Given the slightly unusual circumstances, the regular 'what does it all mean for Investors' table will not appear this week. Suffice to say that best-case outcomes are RONF increases of:

- 44.5% for MIN#001
- 105.6% for MIN#002
- 35.5% for MIN#005
- 0.0% for MIN#015
- 33.3% for MIN#REC

Hawthorn v West Coast (Hawthorn 65-0)

Once again Hawthorn are the unanimous tip. Looks to be an easy Hawks victory although Chi and Quila only have it as a 2-2½ goal game.

Richmond v Carlton (Richmond 48-17)

Blues support comes from Quila, Shadow, CTL and 14 of the MM models. This one feels like a coin toss to me.

Kangaroos v St Kilda (Kangaroos 58-7)

My the pre-season seems such a long way away now doesn't it? The Saints only friends are Shadow and 6 of the MM models.

Many Investors are hoping the Saints can at least stay in touch.

Western Bulldogs v Port Adelaide (Western Bulldogs 65-0)

All the support's with the Dogs and for good reason. Chi and Quila are tipping 3½-4 goal wins and the bookies are tipping a 5½ goal margin.

Melbourne v Brisbane Lions (Brisbane Lions 65-0)

The Lions, it seems, in a canter (do Lions canter?) Chi and Quila are a little circumspect, however, and see only a $2-2\frac{1}{2}$ goal margin.

Fremantle v Essendon (Essendon 43-22)

Easily the most contentious game of this part of the round. In the end, majority support is for the underdog Dons, though Freo is well-supported amongst the MAFL tipping elite, including BKB, Chi and Quila.

The Run Home

This week I thought we'd take a look at the run home for each team, using the MARS Ratings as an indicator of relative team strength.

The table below provides the detail.

By way of example, consider the first row, which describes the run home for Sydney. It tells us that the Swans meet the Pies in Round 14, that the Pies' MARS Rating is 1013.1, and that this game is being played at a Swans home venue (as the box is shaded green). Overall, the aggregated ratings points of all the Swans' opponents over rounds 14 to 22 is 9,097.7. The Swans play 5 games at home (-25), 2 away (+10), and 2 on neutral venues (0), giving a net reduction of 15 points to this total. Their adjusted total is then 9,082.7, which is the highest of all teams, meaning that the Swans, based on this method, have the hardest run to the finals.

(Given that they play the Pies twice, Hawthorn, the Bulldogs and Geelong, this seems like a reasonable assessment.)

Brisbane Lions, the table suggests, have the easiest run to the finals. Certainly the next four or five rounds look to offer attractive points-scoring opportunities; three of the last four look somewhat more challenging, however.

Perhaps most importantly, the table suggests that, amongst the four teams the bookies have as battling for the final spot in the 8 – the Roos, Saints, Blues and Tigers – it's the Tigers who apparently have the best run home.

Team Rating System

MARS is tipping all six favourites this weekend.

For the MARS-favoured teams to at least preserve their current Ratings Points they need to win by the following margins:

- Hawthorn by 18 points or more
- Richmond by 6 points or more
- Kangaroos by 2 points or more
- Bulldogs by 7 points or more
- Bris Lions by 19 points or more
- Fremantle by 11 points or more

The Roos or the Saints need an emphatic victory to press their claims for 8th spot and they need to hope that the Bulldogs soundly defeat Port.

A sizeable victory for Freo over the Dons might also bring them back into contention for a top 8 spot, though even a maximum margin (75 points or more) would be worth only +5.14 points.

The anomaly that we noted last week has been resolved, with the Dees now "No Price" in both Flag and Final 8 markets for Centrebet and the TAB. Domebet are still fielding on the Dees in the Flag market, however, offering a price of \$5,001.

In Final 8 betting we have four teams apparently vying for the 8th spot: the Roos, the Saints, the Blues and the Tigers.

Melbourne, though lengthening a little this week, remain very firm favourites for the Spoon.

Perhaps the biggest surprise here is that MARS sees Port Adelaide winning 6 of its remaining games to scramble into the final 8 at the expense of the Roos.

Interestingly, though MARS ranks Sydney as the number 2 team it predicts that they will finish 3rd, partly as a result of their difficult run home about which we spoke about earlier and partly because of the competition points deficit that have relative to the teams ahead of them.
